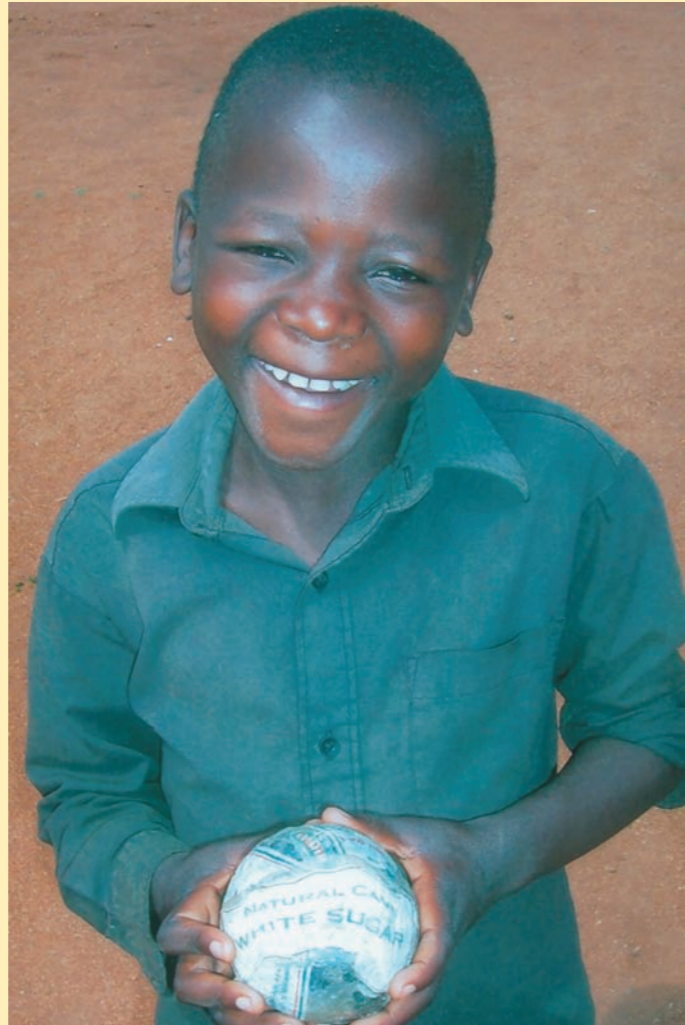


AQUAID LIFELINE NEWS
